FEC RELEASES FIRST FULL PAC STUDY FOR '82 ELECTIONS

WASHINGTON -- Political action committee contributions to federal candidates during the first 18 months of the 1981-82 election cycle reached \$38 million.

The 18-month figures were released today by the Federal Election Commission in a four-volume study entitled FEC Reports on Financial Activity, 1981-82.

From January 1, 1981, through June 30, 1982, PAC's raised a total of \$137.2 million and spent \$103.9 million. Contributions to all federal candidates totalled \$38 million, with \$34 million allocated to active 1982 Congressional candidates.** (PAC's filing monthly reports contributed an additional \$4.4 million to Federal candidates in July 1982.)

Similar information released by the FEC for the same time frame in the 1979-80 election cycle showed \$25 million had been contributed to federal candidates, of which \$20 - \$23 million was given to 1980 Congressional campaigns.

(Figures are in millions of dollars. Information for each cycle represents most of the financial activity for 18 months. However, not all PAC reports are filed on time. Consequently, some PAC activity is not included.)

Total PAC contributions to federal candidates in the 1977-78 election cycle equalled \$35.2 million, of which \$34.1 was contributed to 1978 Congressional races. In 1979-80, total PAC contributions were \$60.2 million; \$55.2 of that total went to 1980 Senate and House campaigns.

Charts on the following page detail PAC activity with regard to particular types of candidates depending on office sought, party affiliation or status as an incumbent, challenger, or open-seat candidate.

PAC's which raised and spent the most money are also listed, in addition to those which contributed the most money to federal candidates during the 18 months.

** In non-election years, PAC's often contribute money to help retire candidates' debts from the previous election. Such contributions may cumulatively total over \$5 million for the entire election cycle. Therefore, a distinction is being made in this release between ALL PAC contributions to ALL Federal candidates, and PAC contributions to candidates involved in the 1982 Congressional elections.
